Principal's Report

National Serviceman

Last week at assembly our captains Keiran Pingiaro and Laura Booth, were presented with some books by members of the Hay Branch of the National Serviceman. Mr Ral Beissel and Mr Breen Schiller were special guests at the assembly and donated some reference books to go into the Stage 1 Home Reading boxes and one to go into the school library. The school enjoys strong ties with our local community and this is a great example of just how supportive the various organisations are in their generous donations to the school. Thank you to Mr Schiller and Mr Beissel for coming along to make the presentation. The books are now available to borrow.

Attendance

Regular attendance at school is important for students to reach their potential. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. While parents are legally responsible for the regular attendance of their children, school staff, as a part of their duty of care, monitors part or whole day absences. All students who are

enrolled at school, regardless of their age, are expected to attend whenever instruction is provided. Parents are required to explain the absences of their children promptly by either letter, phone call or a visit to the front office. If your child is absent, you need to contact the school on 69931270 to explain the reason for the absence. A phone call will be made to you if a satisfactory explanation has not been received by 9:30am. The reasons for absences and lateness will now be scrutinised by the Home School Liaison Officer and the reasons must be acceptable to the Department of Education and Communities. Acceptable reasons include sickness, and medical appointments that could not be made outside of school hours. Long periods of illness will need to be explained by a medical certificate signed by a doctor. Unacceptable reasons include birthday celebrations, shopping trips and sleeping in.

How to Maximise Learning Opportunities for Your Child

Students learn best when they are alert, well fed and have had plenty of sleep. This allows children to concentrate and get the most out of each and every learning opportunity. Children need

more sleep than adults and should be averaging about 10 hours a night. Suitable bed times are between 7:30pm – 9pm at night, certainly no later than 9:30pm. Younger children need more sleep than older children. Children should be eating a substantial, healthy breakfast before school as this aids their concentration in the classroom. At Hay Public School a breakfast program operates five days a week for any student who happens to miss their breakfast in the morning and is served from the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen. Please remember to pack some healthy fruit in your child's lunchbox to further aid in their learning development and to satisfy hunger in a healthy way.
