## **Principal's Report**

### **Creative Catchment Kids Book**

#### **Launch**

Year 6 students Katie Arandt, Molly Christensen, Georgia Mijok, Charly Moorhouse, Gemma Tassell and Emily Headon were all excited to celebrate the launch of their book 'Blorey and the Bidgee'. The girls were part of the Creative Kids Catchment Program, sponsored by the Local Land Services, and received published copies of their books at an official launch last Thursday. Present were Mrs Stacey Staunton Latimer and Mr Owen Dunlop of the Creative Catchment Kids programme; Mr Michael Fayle from the Riverina Local Land Service; Mrs Alex Anthony, Chair of the Murray Local Land Service and Mr Terry Gorman of the Murray Local Land Service.
