Stage 2/3 News Home Reading

All classes have commenced homework and Home reading. Please ensure you listen to your child every day reading aloud and sign their log book.

If , when reading, your child comes to a word they don't know you can encourage them to...

- * Use pictures in the text to help predict the word
- * Suggest they sound out or chunk the word
- * Skip the word, read on and use the context of the sentence to try and work it out. Reread the sentence.

Reading is an essential, life long skill and being a successful reader will build confidence in your child.


