I support P&C fundraisers. Where does my money go?

The answer is to many different things that help support the school and its students. Following consultation with school staff, the P&C has set priorities for the use of funds from its recent and upcoming fundraisers. The following list will help us target our activities and also give you a better idea of where your money goes when you support P&C events. Keep an eye on the fundraising barometer facing Lachlan St to see how we are progressing in meeting our targets.

I. Playground Equipment

The funds raised from the fete, along with other funds held in reserve, have been earmarked for new playground equipment which we hope to have installed before the commencement of Term 4.

2. Split Systems in Classrooms

Upcoming one-off fundraising activities will be directed toward replacing the old heat banks with split systems in the remaining six classrooms. The P&C will be hosting a Black and Bling event at the Hay Services Club on Saturday 18th October 2014 to kick off this appeal so please mark the date in your diaries and further details will follow.

3. Regular Donations and Running Costs

Every year, the P&C contributes a significant amount of funding to activities such as the purchase of presentation day awards, student representative sporting travel, subsidisation of Year 6 t-shirts, Easter hat parade, provision of the water cooler etc. It also has running costs like insurance, auditing, repairs and maintenance. These regular donations and running costs amount to approximately \$3,000 per year and are generally funded through the P&C's regular fundraising activities such as term discos, mufti days, mother's and father's day stalls and minor raffles.
