It's the question that every parent, especially mothers ask: "What's going on with my teenage boy?"

Celia Lashlie, a researcher and social commentator has some very up front and clear answers.

In 2004, she completed the Good Man Project. It created discussion within and between 25 boys' schools throughout New Zealand to define what makes a good man in the 21st Century'.

The results provided a significant insight into the minds of teenage boys and what they are feeling at this period in their lives. In the years since completing the project, Celia has continued to work with mothers as they wrestle with the challenges of parenting their adolescent sons.

Celia has some confronting suggestions for mums and dads. Her strongest challenge is for women to rethink the way they interact with the men in their lives – their sons and their husbands – if they want to see their sons become the good men they want then to be.
