Shear Outback is pleased to announce that Emily Gibson of the Hay Public School is the winner of the Primary

school age (5-12 years) short story competition. A panel of writers chose her entry, "Harnie", from 91 stories received from all over Australia. The winner was announced by best-selling writer Denis McIntosh at the induction of five shearing legends into the Australian Shearers' Hall of Fame. Denis is best-known as author of the epic memoir of shearing days "Beaten by a Blow".

Emily Gibson, a year six student, is the daughter of Robert and Markeeta Gibson of "Croidon", Hay, NSW. For her story which according to the judges "told of the arc of a day's shearing with sensitive attention to detail", she will receive a Certificate of Achievement and a cheque for \$200.

Shear Outback also wishes to congratulate all students who entered. Among highly commended stories were "The Great Shearing Story" by Devlin Clarke, "Living Two Lives" by Hugh Duncan, "Lily and Dusty" by Kate Turner, "Shearing" by Alice Booth, "Close Shave" by Ryan Booth, "Life as a Sheep" by Georgia Wragge and "The Shearing Shed" by Max Day.
