**RIP IT UP** Reading is a research based reading intervention program based on Working Memory Theory. Working Memory plays a crucial role both in supporting learning and in maintaining focused behaviour in practical solutions. A student's verbal Working Memory skills are predictors of performance in complex cognitive tasks including reading and comprehension. Rip it Up Reading uses four distinct factors to assist in learning to read. **Chunking, Repetition, Pace, Understand, and apply Working Memory Theory to reading.** Each time a child rips through their reading they know they have accomplished, they know they are moving forward, progressing... they are *RIPPING* through their reading! Students at Hay Public School are chosen to

participate in the RIUR program for half hour sessions once a week. They work with trained Rip it Up Reading tutors, Mrs Kathy Duncan, Mrs Sharyn Headon and Ms Kirsten Hutchings. Students usually work in small groups of 2 or 3 and progress is monitored twice a term.

#### Life Education Visit

The Healthy Harold van is due to visit our school in Week 7 – Mon, Tues, Wed ( 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> June)

All classes will participate in the lessons as follows

**KW- Harold's Surprise** : Healthy food choices, importance of physical activity, safety.

**K/IZ & I/2B - Harold's Mystery Tour :** Body workings, safe use and storage of medicines, peer pressure and coping strategies, safety and decision making

2/3S - Harold's Diary: Friendship, resilience, expressing emotions, coping strategies, healthy food choices active lifestyles

**3/4R & 4/5H -Bcyberwise :** Explores cyber safety through animation, discussion and problem solving

**5/6P & 5/6CC - On the case :** Short and long term effects of smoking, effects of passive smoking, laws, peer influence and refusal skills.

All these programs address content and outcomes within the NSW PDHPE curriculum. Teachers will follow up these visits within the classroom and students will require the student booklet in order to participate fully in these lessons. The cost of the visit and booklet is **\$10 per student**. Please ensure you have paid by **Friday 3rd June** to ensure your child's participation.
