Hints and Tips No. 3: Writing notes



Parents or caregivers are required by law to provide an explanation to the principal to say why their child was absent from school.

- A note of explanation should contain:
- 1. Date that the note was written;
- Child's name;
- 3. Days/dates the child was absent from school;
- 4. The reason the child was absent;
- 5. The signature of the childs parent or caregiver.

If more than one child from the same family has been absent a separate note for each child should be written.

A note should be brought to school on the first day the student returns to school after an absence. Your school is required to investigate all unexplained absences (where a child has been absent and no explanation has been received) within two days. Did your child give the note to their teacher? This can sometimes be a problem with younger children.

Reading is one of the most important skills that human beings use on a daily basis. The need to read is central to the way we function. Home reading is an integral part of your child's homework and it is recommended that your child reads every

day for 15 to 25 minutes.

Early Action for Success

Well-developed literacy and numeracy skills are essential to students' success at school and fundamental to improving their life chances in a diverse and ever changing world.

This year our school has been selected as an Early Action for Success school. The Early Action for Success strategy aims to improve students' performance through a targeted approach in the early years.

The strategy involves-

* early identification of the level of attainment in literacy and District Trials in Deni (Memorial Park) on Wednesday 8th March numeracy of each individual child for K-2, and tailoring a specific (9.30 - 11.30). the cost is \$2.00. They will be involved in regular professional learning that ensures high quality teaching and learning are embedded in their daily practice.

I look forward to working with the whole school community, students, teachers, and parents in implementing this strategy in our school to ensure the success of all our students.
