#### Professional Learning L3 language, Learning & Literacy

Last Thursday, Stage One staff travelled to Griffith to undertake initial training in L3. L3 is a classroom intervention, targeting reading and writing. It provides rich literacy experiences through systematic and explicit teaching and complements the daily literacy program.

#### Reading K-2

Students will take part in independent learning activities to consolidate explicit instruction given by their teacher during small group reading lessons. When first learning to read, children are taught the necessary strategies to decode print and make meaning from text. As children progress with their reading, they are taught to think deeply about texts using **Reciprocal Reading** strategies. In small groups, children are taught to use four key strategies in order to comprehend a passage from a text. Firstly, they predict what they think will happen in the text. After reading the text, they then work together to clarify words that they did not know how to say or know the meaning of. They pose questions to the group about what they have read and what they are wondering. The children are also taught to summarise the information that they learned from reading the text in their own words.

#### Writing K-2

In L3, children will participate in daily writing around a shared text or shared experience. The class engages in quality talk around texts in order to develop a deep understanding of the text. This includes talk about characters, their actions and the author's intention for writing. The children are able to make personal connections with the text and / or make connections between the texts and with the real world.

K-2 staff will be engaged in professional learning of L3 over the next two years. We are looking forward to developing our knowledge and understanding of Literacy, Language and Learning and implementing this into our classrooms.


