The Tell Them From Me Student Feedback Survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other the other. public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey aims to help improve student learning outcomes and measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement class teacher. and effective teaching practices. You may remember that our Have a great week! students also participated in a Tell Them From Me student survey in Term I this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student **Principal** responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year. I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically

take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 21 August and 13 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey has been sent home with students. If you do not want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by 20th August 2017.

The school does its best to maintain good communication with parents about excursions, up-coming events and due payments. Notes are always sent out, articles appear in the Hay Happenings and teachers always advise students in their classroom. It is a parent's responsibility to read the notes and newsletters, store the notes and mark down important information. 
