#### Principal's Report

#### **Book Week**

This week heralded the start of Book Week 2017 and the Children's Book Council of Australia is celebrating its 72<sup>nd</sup> year. The theme for Children's Book Week this year is: 22 August and 21 October. Participating in the survey is **Escape to Everywhere.** On a basic level, we want kids to entirely voluntary, however, your responses are very much connect by simply participating in the act of reading whether that reading be a short-listed book, a magazine article about football heroes or a sign saying 'Wet Paint'. We want them to understand the prevalence of reading in their lives, and how important it is to both enjoy reading **UNSW Spelling Competition** and develop reading skills. Delving deeper, we encourage children to MAKE connections between what they read, and other things they think, feel, or know. A Book Fair will be run in the library for the week and students are encouraged to come and spend some of their pocket money on a good book. A celebration of Book Week, along with a book character parade was held at a special assembly yesterday in the school hall. Thank you to parents and guests who came in support of our school.




