Principal's Report

NAPLAN

Tests are conducted in Writing and Language Conventions on Tuesday, Reading on Wednesday and Mathematics on Thursday. Children are The weather at the moment is very changeable. Attendance

Attendance at school is most important and any student enrolled in a NSW school is required to attend school each day it is open for instruction. Principals are legally responsible for maintaining accurate records of student attendance. When reasons for absences are provided to the school by parents, principals are accountable for their decision to record a as satisfactory an explanation for an absence and will record that absence as unjustified. Principals may also request medical certificates if illness occurs frequently or is prolonged. It is the responsibility of parents or carers to make sure that their children attend school each day. It is important to understand that parents (including carers) may be prosecuted if children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unjustified absences from school.

NAPLAN

Students in Year 3 and 5 will sit their NAPLAN test during Week 3 (15th, 16th and 17th May). NAPLAN is a national assessment for all students in Years 3,5,7 and 9. Information regarding NAPLAN was sent home with students last week.

Tests are conducted in **Writing** and **Language** Conventions on Tuesday, **Reading** on Wednesday and **Mathematics** on Thursday. Friday is a catch-up day for any students who may miss a test during the week. Children are encouraged to have early nights and a good breakfast each morning so that they are able to concentrate throughout the testing period. This is the best preparation that children can have for their tests. If you have any questions or concerns about NAPLAN and your child sitting the test please contact the school.

This term our whole school focus is on implementing visible learning in our classrooms. Visible Learning is the result of the research undertaken by John Hattie to understand what provides the most success in learning.

Our goal, as teachers, is to develop learners who can set goals, articulate what they are learning and know what their next learning steps are. Successful learners strive to use self-regulation strategies when assessing their own work, they ask questions and actively seek feedback.

Learning intentions for Reading, Writing and Numeracy and related success criteria are displayed in our

classrooms. This ensures our students know what they are learning, and what is needed in the task to make them successful.

These are known as:

WALT- the learning intention (We are learning to....)
And

WILF - the success criteria (What I'm looking for....)

Student work is celebrated by displaying their work on our **WOW** or **WAGOLL**

(What a Good One Looks Like) Walls

Our K-4 focus continues to be writing, reading and comprehension and implementing number talks into the daily maths routine. We look forward to celebrating the growth and impact of student learning in our classrooms.


