# FOCUS ON READING



The more that you read, the more things you will know.

The more that you learn, the more places you'll Go !! -- Dr. Seuss

One of the most important things parents can do, beyond keeping their children healthy and safe, is to read with them.

Reading and sharing stories can

- \* help your child become familiar with sounds, words, language and the value of books
- \* spark your child's imagination, stimulate curiosity and help their brain development
- \* help your child's development of early literacy skills such as the ability to listen and understand words.

Research shows that starting in Kindergarten, if a student reads 20 minutes a day at home, they will hear 1.8 million words per year.

Daily reading assists the brain in making connections between the written and spoken word, developing their vocabulary in the process. Reading, spelling and vocabulary are critically important to a child's lifelong achievement.

Through daily reading, children are exposed to a world outside their own reality. It expands their know-how, opens their minds and creates potential for the continuation of ideas and an endless number of opportunities.


