Principal's Report

Regional Cross Country

Bullying is Everyone's Responsibility

The school has a duty of care to keep everyone safe and behaviour that causes concern should be dealt with in a timely manner. Anyone who is the victim or a witness to bullying has a responsibility to report it straight away and to keep on reporting it if it does not stop. It is the responsibility of the school to investigate any reports and deal with it under the Discipline Policy of the school. The school will act based on the information that they receive through their investigations. Parents need to be aware that there are many steps in the Discipline Policy that need to be followed and greenslips, detentions and suspension are not always the end result. A copy of the school's Discipline Policy is published on the school's website and is reviewed regularly.

Language, Learning and Literacy

Kinder and Stage I classes are all implementing L3 within their classrooms. This program supports the regular classroom literacy program that is informed by the K-6 English Syllabus and Literacy Learning Progressions. It is wonderful to observe students becoming more independent and taking responsibility for their own learning during group rotations Students are becoming successful readers and writers and are engaged in the varied literacy centres set up by their teachers. Kinder and Stage I teachers have all undertaken intensive professional training in order to ensure program is implemented successfully and gains the exemplary results.
