Principal's Report

School Uniform

Recently the Department of Education has changed its school uniform policy. To align with the new policy, our school has had to make some changes to our uniform policy in order to comply. In a recent survey of our families, the majority of families who returned the survey did not want a change to the school's current uniform. With that in mind, the P&C, school staff and School Council discussed ways in which we could make some changes to ensure that our students were given equal opportunities and a clear choice of what they can wear. Hay Public School will no longer have a girls' uniform and a boys' uniform. Students will be given the option to wear either of the current, existing uniforms for summer and winter. For example, in summer students will have an option to wear the current summer dress uniform or grey shorts and a blue button-up shirt. In winter, students will have the option to wear the current navy pinafore with white shirt uniform or grey pants and a blue button-up shirt.
