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School Uniform FAQ

Has the school uniform changed?

No. There has been no change in the school uniform. Earlier this year our families were surveyed and the majority of families returned a vote to say they did not want to change our current school uniform.

Every girl has the option to wear grey shorts in summer, grey pants in winter and a light blue, button up shirt.
