Principal's Report

Parliamentarian Nominations

Nomination forms are available from the front office and are to be handed in by Friday 23rd November. After nominations are confirmed, speeches and elections will be held to elect twelve parliamentarians for our school. Speeches and voting for parliamentarians will take place on Monday 3rd December.

Planning for 2019

End of Year Evaluations

Recently we have held an evaluation of our 2018 School Plan. Our strategic directions, student wellbeing, staff wellbeing, teaching, learning and parent involvement were all evaluated. Findings of the evaluation include: our student population is well supported with the various focus will be to further strengthen all of these areas.
