#### Selective High School Applications

Application is required this month for parents or carers of Year 5 students who wish their children to be considered for placement in Year 7 at a selective high school in 2021. There are 17 fully selective and 24 partially selective high schools, one virtual secondary school, Aurora College, for students in rural and remote areas and 4 selective agricultural high schools in NSW offering places in Year 7. Three of the agricultural high schools offer boarder places. Expression of Interest letters have been sent out to all Year 5 students and parents must apply online at the following link: https://education.nsw.gov.au/publicschools/selective-high-schools-andopportunity-classes/ year-7/application-process. If you have no internet access at home, you can go to a public library where internet access is free. Applications are open from 8 October to 11 November 2019.
