Principal's Report

School Uniform

Why do students wear a school uniform? Uniforms are sets of clothing worn by all members of a particular organisation. Certain jobs require uniforms and schools have uniforms. Police personnel, members of the defence force, nurses, bank employees, McDonalds restaurant workers and firefighters wear special uniforms that help identify them with their profession. A school uniform teaches students to dress smartly and take pride in their appearance. It teaches students to respect and value their place of learning which instils a sense of pride. It was so nice on Monday morning, when I addressed our students, to see everyone dressed in their appropriate school uniforms. Thank you to all parents who positively encourage their children to do so.

Positive Behaviour Awards

Well done to the students who received 'Star Awards' at our first STAR assembly last Friday. 'Star Awards' are part of our positive behaviour program and are awarded from each class on a monthly basis. Students who display the qualities of respect, doing their best and making efforts to continually improve in all areas of school life, will be considered for this award. The school rewards positive behaviour in many other ways including: 'School Rule Awards'; 'Merit Awards'; 'Yellow Award Draws'; 'No Greenslip Rewards'; 'Principal's Lunch Awards'; and other in-class rewards. Children are encouraged to display positive behaviour on a daily basis and take part in all activities on offer. This will promote a sense of belonging, wellbeing and social connection in and amongst our students.

Early Action for Success

Again this year, Hay Public School is funded by the department to take part in the Early Action for Success strategy. Mrs Suzanne Murphy, in her role as Deputy Principal, works closely with Kindergarten to Year 4 teachers in ensuring that students in each and every classroom are supported to reach their full, educational potential. Students' progress is tracked regularly in literacy and numeracy and students who require assistance with their learning are provided with the appropriate support. This may be in the form of small learning groups, one on one support or differentiation of the curriculum in the classroom. School Learning Support Officers are employed to assist teachers in providing learning support to our students.

Visible Learning

Our K-4 classes are well underway with their learning. This year we will be focusing on developing Visible learning within our classrooms along with a positive growth mindset. Students are in the process of developing their learning goals for literacy and numeracy. Developing learning goals is encouraged by all teachers and is a key component to visible learning.

Visible Learning is children taking ownership for their own learning.

Visible learners ...

- ☺ talk about what they are learning
- ☺ explain the next steps in their learning
- ☺ set learning goals
- ☺ see errors as opportunities for further learning
- ☺ know what to do when they are stuck
- ☺ seek feedback



Throughout the school day time is spent discussing with students what it means to be a successful learner and developing strategies to achieve this.

Students also need to know what they are learning and what is needed in the task to make them successful.

And

(Success Criteria) **WILF- What I'm looking for**



Learning intentions and success criteria are developed by the teacher for all literacy and numeracy lessons and are visibly displayed in the classrooms to support all students learning and progress. All classrooms also display student work on their

The Hay Public School P&C Association operates the canteen at the district swimming carnival (Friday 1st March) to raise money for our students and we need your help.


Volunteers are urgently needed to help on the canteen and to cook the BBQ. Donations of fruit, cakes and slices are needed and greatly appreciated.


