#### **VP** Day

This year marks the 74<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Victory in the Pacific Day (VP Day). Returned servicemen and citizens of Australia come together to commemorate the surrender of Japan in 1945 to the allied forces. For Australians, VP Day meant that the Second World War was finally over after six long years of battles.
