Principal's Report

Riverina PSSA Athletics Carnival

Congratulations to the sixteen students who represented Hay Public School and the Deniliquin District at the Riverina PSSA Athletics Trials in Albury last Friday. Students all performed well and pleasing results were achieved. Nathaniel Clarke was placed first in the 11 years boys 1500m and 800m. He will go onto represent the Riverina at the state carnival in Homebush later in the year. This was an excellent result for Nate who trains and works hard to achieve what he does. Other pleasing results were from Jim Houston – 4th in the 800m and 1500m, Emily Cai – 4th in the 200m and Ben Clark - 6th in the 800m. Thank you to Mrs Houston for her assistance in managing the team and for bringing home the District Athletics trophy to its rightful home.

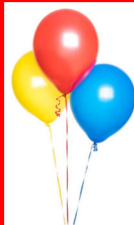
