The raffle will be drawn at the Easter Hat Parade on Friday 12th April and funds raised go towards the Year 6 Farewell and gift to the school.

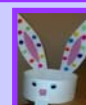

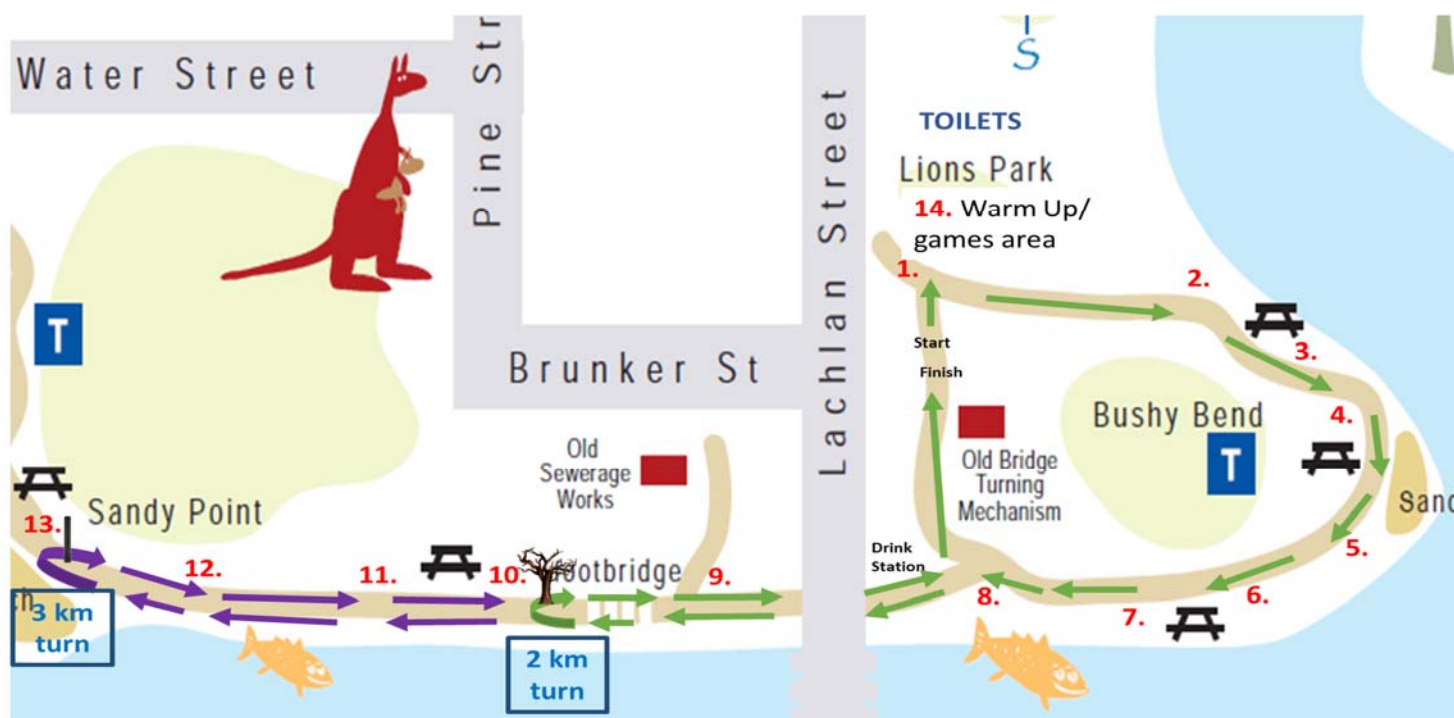

Mrs Murphy's Instructional Leader Report

Writing

Our literacy focus area for K-2 visible learning intentions during this term has been writing.

The writing process involves students planning, composing, recording, revising and publishing their work. This involves class teachers modelling the writing focus- *thinking aloud as they write*, involving students in shared and guided writing opportunities - *writing together and independently with teacher support* and writing independently- *putting into practice what they have learnt* during the modelled and guided writing sessions.

Class teachers have been modelling ways to make writing sound good and look good. Classes have been setting their own whole class learning intentions and success criteria to help with this. There are many outstanding pieces of writing on display in the classrooms on the WAGOLL Walls and parents are most welcome to visit classrooms to view student work.

Next term writing will continue to be a focus area with class learning intentions and success criteria embedded into the process. Class teachers will also be focussing on individual student writing goals to help students become creative and independent writers.
