Positive Social Skills

Children who are good at making and keeping friends use positive social skills. Parents, carers and staff help children learn positive social skills by guiding them as young Carol Oataway children and providing opportunities for play where

children can practise their skills. Key social skills that help with friendships include cooperation, communication, empathy, emotional control and responsibility. All children go through friendship conflicts at some stage of their schooling. Encourage and discuss with your child some positive social skills and behaviours to use when this occurs - taking turns, asking questions, refusing to join in negative behaviours, following the rules of the game, cooperating and playing fair.

The teachers at Hay PS have been very busy over the past few weeks collecting assessment data and beginning the process of writing student reports. They are pleased with the progress each student has made and look forward to celebrating their achievements. Reports will go home on Friday 28th June, with Parent Teacher Interviews taking place the following week during Week 10. The mid-year report will give each child a grade for each key learning area, as well as an assessment of each child's effort in class. The descriptors of learning used in our reports are self-explanatory describing where each student is in relation to their grade expectation. I urge all parents to attend these interviews as they are a part of our reporting process, as well as a great opportunity to meet with your child's teacher and discuss any concerns you may have.




CHANGED CONDITIONS
