Principal's Report

Hand Hygiene

We are certainly going through some 'different' times at the moment and as a school we are promoting hand hygiene in our students to slow the spread of any germs or viruses. Our practice is:

I. Students sanitise their hands on the way into the classroom, before they eat and on the way out of the classroom;

2. We remind students to wash their hands with soap for 20 seconds after using the toilet;

3. When coughing or sneezing, students are taught to use their elbows, not their hands; and

4. We avoid hand shaking and ask students to avoid

touching their noses and mouths with their hands.

If any student is clearly unwell with a respiratory illness, they are asked to stay away from school until they are feeling better.

Social Distancing

The Department of Education has put out a directive that schools will remain open and social distancing will be encouraged to help slow the spread of the coronavirus. In light of this, the school has cancelled all assemblies, all performances, all excursions, all sports carnivals and all interschool sport until further notice. School sport on Thursdays will go ahead as normal.

Tell Them From Me Survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used Tell Them From Me to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school. I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 16 March and 9 April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. A consent form and FAQs for parents/ carers about the survey was sent home last week. The forms only need to be returned if you do not want your child to

property.
