Principal's Report Return to School

Next week we enter into Phase 3, where students will return 5 days per week. From May 25, all students will be expected to be back in the classroom and will be marked absent if they are not at school. Students will only be exempt under medical advice from a doctor and a doctor's certificate will be needed. Classes will run as normal with all class teachers present.

Activities

Whilst there has been some easing of restrictions, the school will continue to not have mass gatherings such as assemblies, morning musters, school performances and special events. Excursions will still not run at this stage. Sport is allowed but there is to be no contact sport. Sport groups are able to take short walks to other venues in the town to access sporting facilities. The canteen will continue to operate as normal.

Student Reports

Semester 1 reports will be delayed this year due to the interruption to learning that has taken place. Reports will reflect both learning at school and learning at home and will be focused on outcomes in literacy and numeracy. The report will go out to parents / carers at the commencement of Term 3 and parents will be contacted to discuss the progress of their child with the classroom teacher. More information regarding reporting and assessment will be forthcoming over the coming weeks.

Social Distancing

Where possible, parents and carers are asked not to be

present on the school site or to enter classrooms. Parents are asked to 'Kiss and Drop' their children at the school gate in the morning and wait at the gate in the afternoon. The school canteen will be running as normal with physical distancing measures and hand hygiene firmly in place. Parents can pay money to the canteen online, through the 'Make a Payment' section on the school's website or money can be dropped into the front office. Students are able to take money and orders to the canteen every day.

Health Advice

We acknowledge that there is a great deal of concern about people's personal safety during the COVID-19 pandemic, but the risk to children is lower and the benefits of school are great. Please follow all health advice and keep your child at home if they are unwell or have a respiratory illness.

Attendance

Students who have been actively participating in their home learning and are returning their work packs have been marked present. Students who have not returned their work packs, or have not contacted the school have been marked as absent. As from May 25, **all students** are expected to make a return to school.

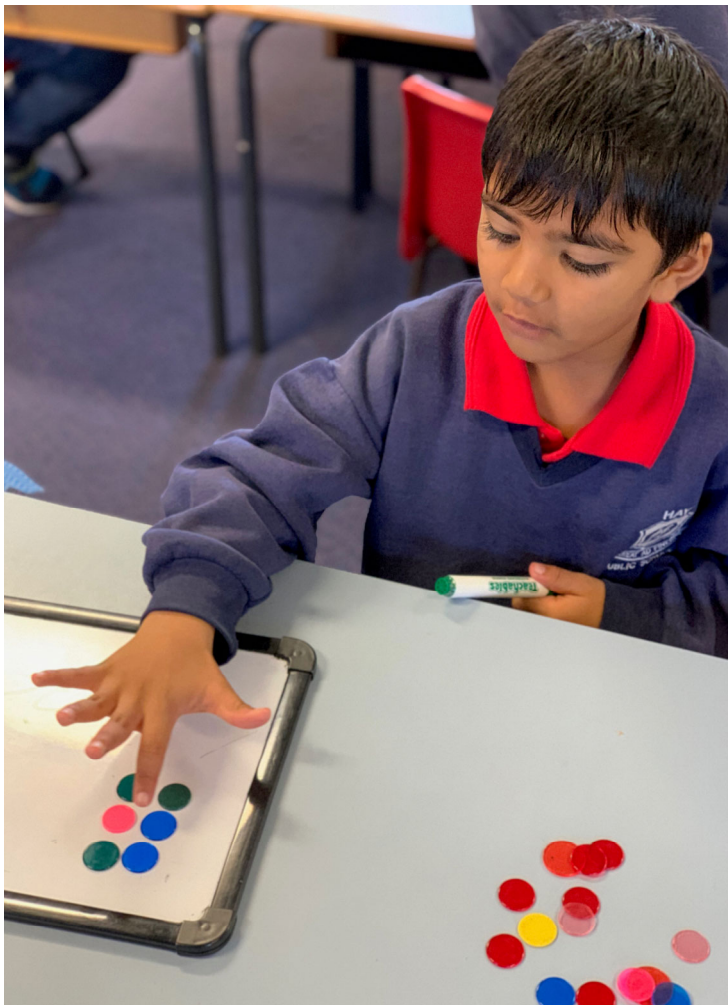

TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?

HERE'S HOW
TO TELL

STAY HOME IF ...

- Your child feels too sick for regular activities
- Yellow or green pus appears
- The temperature on an oral thermometer reads 100° F or higher (100.4 for an ear, rectal, or forehead temp)
- You suspect flu—it spreads rapidly
- Your child has a migraine—throbbing, severe pain with moodiness, fatigue, and sensitivity to light
- Redness and itchiness affect all or most of your child's body
- Your doctor suspects—or diagnoses—strep throat
- Your child is vomiting or has uncontrollable diarrhea

Symptoms:

- COUGH AND OTHER COLD SYMPTOMS
- EYE DISCHARGE
- FEVER
- FLU
- HEADACHE
- RASH
- SORE THROAT
- STOMACHACHE

GO BACK TO SCHOOL AFTER ...

- Fever decreases and your child feels better
- The amount of pus decreases, using antibiotic eye drops for 24 hours
- Body temperature reaches normal
- Fever has been gone for 24 hours
- Taking pain medication
- The rash is gone—or the doctor gives the OK
- 24 hours after beginning antibiotics
- Vomiting stops and your child has control of bathroom breaks
