COVID-19 Testing

The NSW Government now requires any student who is unwell with cold and flu-like symptoms to undergo COVID testing. Any student with symptoms such as fever, cough, to select two candidates to take place in the CWA Public runny nose, shortness of breath, headache, muscle or joint pains should present for testing. Students are unable to return to school until they provide a negative result to the school and until symptoms are clear.
