In School COVID Tutoring

As we all know, 2020 was a tough year for our students and teachers. It was a year that included seven weeks of remote learning due to COVID-19. For our students, this was an unsettling time. The government and department have recognised this with the roll out of a \$337 million COVID The 2021 COVID intensive learning support program. support program will provide small group tuition for students who need it most across NSW primary, secondary and specialist schools. School this allocation will be used to provide small group tuition. This will be conducted during school hours with a focus on literacy and numeracy.

Early Action for Success

Mrs Suzanne Murphy, in her part-time role as Deputy Principal, works closely with Kindergarten to Year 2 teachers in ensuring that students in each and every K-2 classroom are supported to reach their full, educational potential. Students' progress is tracked regularly in literacy In a review of COVID regulations, parents and carers can and numeracy and students who require assistance with their learning are provided with the appropriate support. This may be in the form of small learning groups, one on one support or differentiation of the curriculum in the classroom. School Learning Support Officers are employed to assist teachers in providing learning support to our students.
