Welcome Back

Welcome back to Term 2, to what should be a very productive term. I hope that all students had a safe and relaxing holiday. This term promises to be a very busy one and a calendar of events is enclosed in this newsletter for parents to keep in a handy place.

Rotary Peace Pole

Rotary was established in Australia in 1921. To celebrate this available later in the year. centenary, the Rotary Club of Canberra Burley Griffin, ACT, Uniform invited 100 Rotary Clubs from around Australia to donate a Peace Pole to a school. As part of this Peace Project, the Rotary Club of Woden Daybreak, ACT, donated a Peace Pole to Hay Public School. The poles has been erected at our school and was unveiled in a special ceremony on 20th April. Student leaders and special guests led the ceremony and Satoshi Maema presented the school with a special gift from the Embassy of Japan in Canberra. The pole has four sides, each side with the message 'May Peace Prevail On Earth' in a different language, symbolising our common wish for a World at Peace. Our school selected four languages which reflected the languages spoken by the occupants of the Hay Prisoner of War camp that was in operation during World War 11. The languages include Italian, Japanese, Hebrew and English.

ANZAC Day

ANZAC Day falls on this Sunday (25th April) and students are encouraged to represent the school in the town march. Students are asked to assemble outside the town library in Suzanne Murphy Lachlan Street at 9:45am. The march starts at 10:00am. Check-in assessment for Years 4 and 6

Year 4 and 6 students will participate in a reading and numeracy check-in assessment over the next three weeks.

The check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 4 and 6 students during Term 2 Weeks I through to 3. Students with a disability will receive the same level of support during the assessment that they would normally receive in the classroom.
