Principal's Report

ANZAC Day

Thanks to our captains Matilda Nisbet, Dan Jamieson, Emily Taylor and Archie Houston for leading our students in the march and representing our school in laying a wreath at the ANZAC service. It is most important that our children learn and continue the strong traditions of ANZAC Day for our future generations.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN testing will occur between the dates 11-14 May for students in Year 3 and Year 5. Students will complete language and writing tests on Tuesday 11th May, reading tests on Wednesday 12th May and numeracy tests on Thursday 13th May. Any students who miss tests will have the opportunity to catch up on Friday 14th May. Results of these tests should be available later in the year.

Attendance

Attendance at school is most important and any student enrolled in a NSW school is required to attend school each day it is open for instruction. Principals are legally responsible for maintaining accurate records of student attendance. When reasons for absences are provided to the school by parents, principals are accountable for their decision to record a student's absence as justified. Principals may decline to accept as satisfactory an explanation for an absence and will record that absence as unjustified. Principals may also request medical certificates if Suzanne Murphy illness occurs frequently or is prolonged. It is the responsibility of parents or carers to make sure that their children attend school

each day. It is important to understand that parents (including carers) may be prosecuted if children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unjustified absences from school. The Home School Liaison Officer, employed by the Department of Education, monitors attendance at our school on a regular basis and will contact parents if concerns exist.

Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening. Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records). Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying. However, these conflicts need to be addressed and resolved.

Winter Uniform

Presently the weather is very changeable. Students are to wear their winter uniforms to school so that they remain warm at all times. The uniform options include a navy tunic, white blouse, navy tights and black shoes or long grey pants, blue shirt, grey socks and black shoes. Jumpers are worn with both options and must be navy in colour. School ties are optional for all.

Riverina AFL Team


Good luck to Archie Houston who will represent the Riverina and play in the NSWPSSA State AFL Championships, held in Byron Bay next week.


