Principal's Report

COVID Restrictions

With the recent outbreak and subsequent lockdown in Victoria, the following guidelines apply:

- Students must remain at home if they are unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms. If they are unwell they must receive a negative COVID test and be symptom free before returning to school;
- If students have been to a venue of concern they must comply with the self-isolation and testing requirements as directed by the relevant Health Department;
- If students are travelling from outside the 'border bubble', they will need to sign a declaration in accordance with NSW Health requirements;
- Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and self-isolate until a negative result is received;
- All visitors to a school site must be well and symptom free, comply with sign-in arrangements, and maintain a physical distance of 1.5m; and
- To minimise the amount of visitors on school grounds, parents are asked to 'kiss and drop' their child at the school gate.

I urge all parents to attend these interviews, as they are a part of our reporting process, as well as a great opportunity to meet with your child's teacher and discuss their learning goals and achievements.
