Principal's Report

Stage 3 Excursion

This week our Stage 3 students and their teachers are on their major excursion to Canberra. Students have been completing units of work on 'Government, Democracy and Australia as a Nation' in the classroom and the visit to Parliament House and the old Parliament House will provide further insight into the learning that has taken place. Other places to be visited include the: National Museum, Australian War Memorial, National Gallery, National Capital Exhibition Centre, Beijing Gardens and the Australian Institute of Sport. I look forward to hearing all about the excursion highlights upon the students' return. Thanks to Mrs Simpson for her organisation of this excursion and to Mrs Shea, Mrs Cullenward, Miss Jamieson, Ms Hutchings, Mrs Spiers and Ms Jones for providing supervision for our students whilst they are away.

Reports

Semester One reports are due to go out on Thursday 17th June. Reports give a snapshot of the educational progress that your child has made over the past semester, as well as their social development and commitment to learning. Teachers assess students at Hay Public School against state wide standards and use a rigorous assessment process in order to do so. In addition to written reports we encourage parents and caregivers to attend scheduled parent / teacher meetings.

Parent-Teacher Interviews

Parents are reminded to book interviews with their child's class teacher. Interviews will take place on Monday 21st June, Tuesday 22nd June and Wednesday 23rd June and booking sheets are available in this newsletter. Interviews can be face to face or by phone and our teachers would like the opportunity to discuss each student's learning achievements with parents. Interviews

provide parents with specific details about each child and enable parents to ask questions, discuss concerns and to learn how they can assist with their child's education.

Attendance

Our target is that all of our students attend school over 90% of the time. Currently we are falling short of this target as only 70% of our students are managing to be at school over 90% of the time. Students who are ill for more than three days in a row are required to provide a medical certificate from their doctor stating that it is necessary to be absent from school. As well, students who have had a substantial amount of sick leave over the past six months will have to supply a medical certificate every time they are ill. Parents will be phoned by the front office if they are required to supply a medical certificate for their child. Children should not stay at home for reasons such as tiredness, shopping or birthdays.

Behaviour

It is always important that the school and families work together when students make poor behaviour choices. When students see that the school and the family are working together to support a positive change in behaviour, it is most likely to occur. It is important for teachers and parents to keep the lines of communication open. If you have any concerns about your child at school, the first line of contact is always the class teacher. More serious concerns can be brought to the attention of the principal.
